At the February 5, 2018, City Council meeting, Sam Cunningham proposed increasing the sales tax from 1.25% to 1.5%, a 20% increase. I voted against the increase. It passed, with Sam Cunningham casting the tie-breaking vote.

OF THE CITY OF WAUKEGAN

ON THE 5th DAY OF FEBRUARY, 2018

It states:

"WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Waukegan has now determined that it is in the best interests of the City to increase the tax on all persons engaged in the business of selling tangible personal property at retail and upon all persons engaged in the business of making sales of service within the City from 1.25% to 1.5%;"
